With much generosity and support, 400 guests, 80 volunteers and 40 Genii, Spark of Genius raised \$240,000 for schizophrenia research.

## Key Role in Global Genetics Study

The Australian Schizophrenia Research Bank has played a key role in a global study that investigated genetic variants associated with schizophrenia.



The study replicated findings from previous genetic research and made new discoveries.

This is the Bank's first contribution to an international study, which involved over 51,000 individuals, and marks an important step, as one of the new genetic discoveries may be implicated in contributing to particular brain abnormalities in schizophrenia. When cases of bipolar disorder were added to the study sample some genetic findings indicated shared genetic susceptibility for both schizophrenia and bipolar disorder.

The study by the Schizophrenia Psychiatric Genome-Wide Association Study Consortium used blood samples from a large number of international projects, including the Australian Schizophrenia Research Bank, and is published in Nature Genetics. The findings identified five genomic loci that

are newly associated with schizophrenia and confirmed two genomic loci previously identified in schizophrenia.

"Our involvement in this global replication study is a first for the Australian Schizophrenia Research Bank, and one that marks the beginning of a more extensive contribution to the international research community," said Prof. Vaughan Carr, CEO of the Schizophrenia Research Institute.

The Australian Schizophrenia Research Bank was established to provide researchers with a unique set of data including blood samples, brain scans and clinical information to further research into schizophrenia within Australia and across the world.

"As the Australian Schizophrenia Research Bank continues to grow, the scientists and clinicians at the Schizophrenia Research Institute, along with our colleagues and affiliates in other institutes and organisations across the globe, are realising the significance of having access to such a valuable resource as this." Prof. Carr said.

# CEO's Report

The Institute's gala ball, Spark of Genius brought together a multitude of supporters for the Institute, with generous contributions from our Genii, all of those that supported the event, and of course everyone who attended on the night to raise money for the Institute.

At the Institute we take a three levelled approach to our research – at the population level, at the individual human level and thirdly at the microscopic level. Cyndi's work focuses at this microscopic level,

concerned with molecules and cells and neurobiological processes that are important for schizophrenia.

With the very generous assistance of Macquarie Group Foundation and NSW Health, the Institute was able to bring Cyndi on board in 2006 and establish the Schizophrenia Research Laboratory to unravel some of the mysteries of the neurobiology of this condition, laying the foundations for more effective treatments and ways of preventing it.

Our work at the Institute has also contributed to an international study that involved over 50,000 people taking part, including almost 1000 through the Australian Schizophrenia Research Bank and our partners at the University of Queensland.
